In addition to the trip, two members of our chapter have been selected to go on Birthright Excel, a prestigious ten-week summer internship program that matches participants with top American companies in Israel. Two years ago, Alex Cohn (2018) interned at Amdocs after his sophomore year as a Corporate Strategy Summer Analyst. This upcoming summer, Jason Cohen (2020) accepted an investment banking internship at Barclays in Tel Aviv. In addition to Birthright Excel, six brothers will be interning in Israel this summer through Onward Israel, Tamid at Penn, or on their own.

Israel Advocacy

The brothers of AEPi Gamma have been at the forefront of Israel advocacy on campus. One of the brothers most heavily involved with Israel at Penn is Jacob Cohen (2020), our newly-elected Master for the 2018-2019 academic year. Aside from AEPi, Cohen was also recently elected to serve as the President of the Penn Israel Public Affairs Committee (PIPAC), a club determined to support a strong U.S.-Israel relationship through involvement in American politics.

On his upcoming leadership responsibilities, Cohen stated that "while both of the commitments will take a lot of time, they are not totally separate. A lot of the people involved in PIPAC are current brothers or prospective brothers of AEPi. So there is a lot of overlap."

In the fall 2017, when Cohen was the head of PIPAC's Legislative Committee, he and Marc Margolis (2020) lobbied the staff of Congressman and former Gamma chapter master Josh Gottheimer (1997). During the meeting, they talked about various challenges facing Jewish students and Israel advocates on campuses across the country. Additionally, Cohen and Margolis outlined ways national leaders can make a difference in fostering a more pro-Israel sentiment on college campuses.

However, this was not the first time Cohen and Margolis teamed up on behalf of Israel. In July of that same year, the two were selected to represent PIPAC at the Saban Leadership Seminar, a multi-day conference for top student activists of the the American Israel Public Affairs Committee's (AIPAC) top student



activists. At Saban, they went through education and training on how to best promote the U.S.-Israel alliance on college campuses.

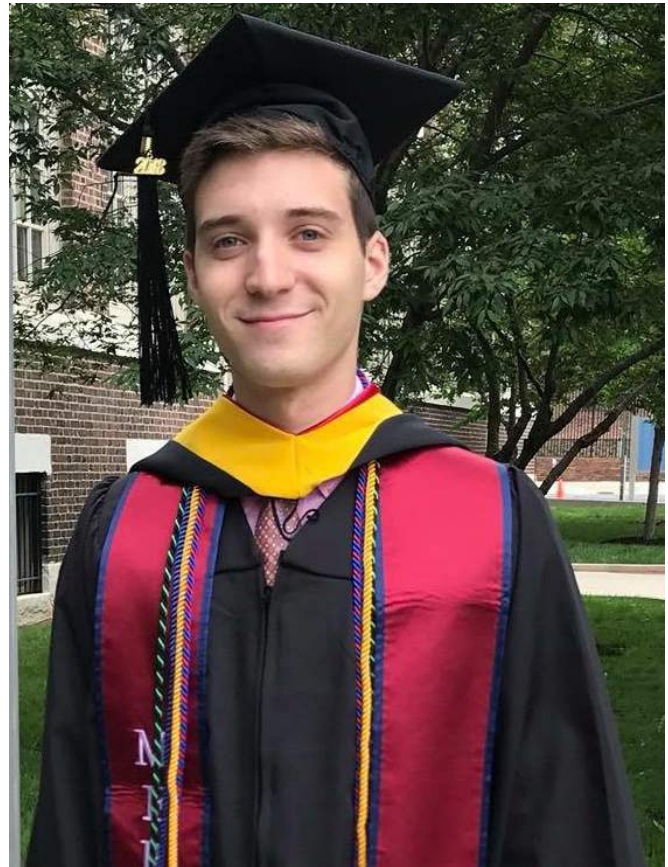


Brother Spotlight:

During Penn's Israel Week, we decided to partner with Hillel to throw a philanthropy downtown. We hosted a party in downtown Philadelphia to raise money for the Israel Children's Cancer Foundation. We were able to raise \$1,300 while creating a social media campaign that reached thousands.



Brothers volunteered at Hillel's soup kitchen, headed by Joe Reinisch (2020), throughout the year. Serving food-insecure individuals from West Philadelphia, this service provided hot meals in the very cold Philadelphia winter on Sunday nights.

In December, we held our second annual AEPuppies event to support Comfort Caring Canines. Comfort Caring Canines is a local organization that supports therapy dogs who visit nursing homes, hospitals and childcare centers throughout the Philadelphia area. After the great turnout last year, we decided to turn this event into an annual fundraiser to not only help a great cause,



but improve the mental health of students during finals week. In order to market the event, we sold t-shirts and created a social media outreach campaign. Students and staff throughout the University came to pet ten emotional support dogs provided by Comfort Caring Canines to make their finals week a little less stressful. This year we had more than 100 attendees and raised more than \$1,500.
