In October 2022 during fall-rush, the Brothers of AEPi participated in the University of Michigan's annual Mud Bowl, a football tournament fundraiser to support the Mott Children's Hospital in Ann Arbor.

The first two rounds brought victories as we defeated both Phi Gamma Delta and Phi Delta Theta to make our first finals appearance in the history of our chapter. Ultimately, AEPi fell short in the championship game as we lost a close one to Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

Most importantly, the Brothers raised almost \$10,000 on behalf of AEPi to donate towards this wonderful cause and all of the participating Umich houses were able to contribute almost \$53,000. Thanks to all of the Brothers who supported us this year.





Brother Lucas Solomon and His Creation of Michigan Youth Sports Initiative (MYSI)







During March of 2022, current Vice-President, Lucas Solomon, created Michigan Youth Sports Initiative (MYSI) with the goal of making organized youth sports accessible for underprivileged youth in the Ypsilanti and Detroit area. Lucas took MYSI to the next level during July of 2022 and turned the club into a 501(c) (3), transforming the club into a non-profit organization. MYSI's mission is to evaluate and eliminate the inequalities seen in sports due to the pay-to-play factor. It bridges the gap in communities through an acquisition of monetary funds from sponsors, donations, and more.

Examples of impacts that MYSI has made in the communities surrounding Ann Arbor are endless, however one stands out to us more than the rest. Specifically, over the first semester of the 2022-2023 school year, MYSI and a total of six current AEPi Brothers helped coach teams of 10-12 year olds in a flag football league. Of course, MYSI paid for the equipment for every player in the league, including cleats and uniforms. Furthermore, MYSI also took the initiative to begin a second and third grade co-ed soccer team. Moving forward, MYSI looks to expand and begin providing youth with access to dance classes and basketball teams.

Looking at what Lucas has accomplished and what he has planned in the near future for MYSI is beyond heart-warming. It is safe to say that the Brothers of AEPi at the Omega Deuteron Chapter are proud of Lucas and wish him luck in his future endeavors.
